- those who in spite of danger dedicate their lives to serving others.

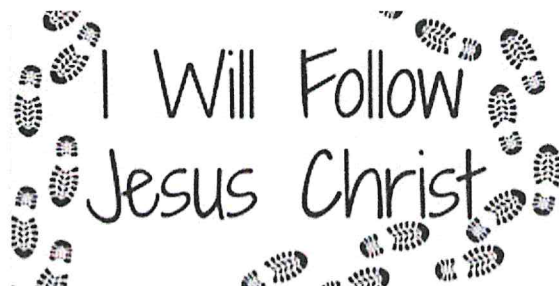
We **pray** for:
