- natural resources to be preserved and the land saved from further desertification.

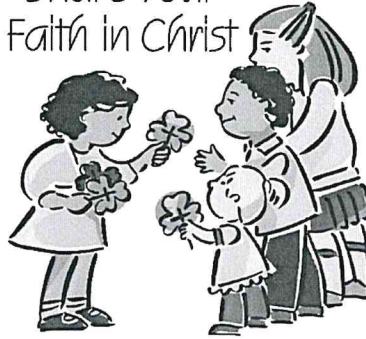
