Welcome back to the Bulletin Financial Report. The Finance Committee continues to carefully monitor the budget. Since our peak tithing year of 2017, total income has declined every year. The committee was considering how to lower expenses just as the pandemic shut us down. We made it through the pandemic due to fewer expenses and the pandemic subsidies that we received. Now that the building is fully operational, we are focused on church stewardship of tithes and expenditures. Each month we will report the monthly tithing and Year-to-Date income from the current year and the 3 years prior to the Pandemic. Thank you to all our very faithful donors.

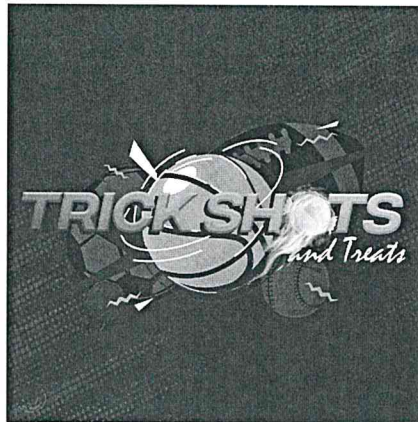
