- careful preservation of the fragile land, sea, and resources.

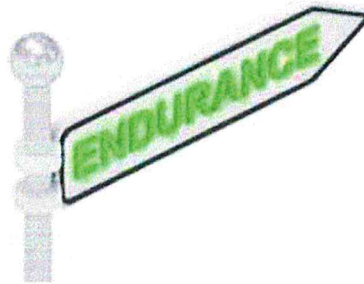
