### **We are thankful for:**

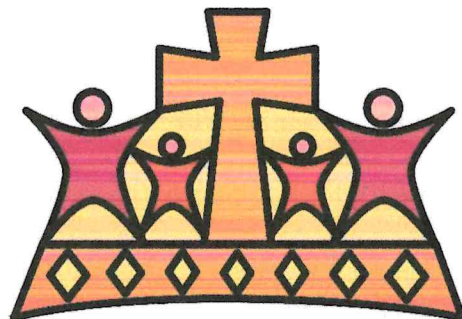
- the vital witness of churches in this region

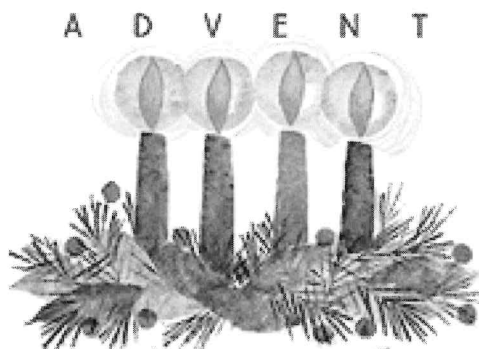
