- stable governance and economies, and rising living standards for many people in recent years.

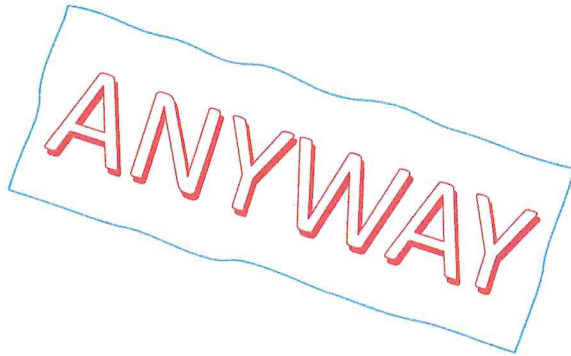

Fee: \$25.00 a week or \$6.00 a day. Each church sending 6 or more workers should also send a donation of at least \$125.00 for building materials. Churches sending fewer than 6 workers should send proportionate donations. Workers are urged to get the support of their local church to help with these expenses.
