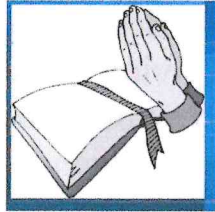

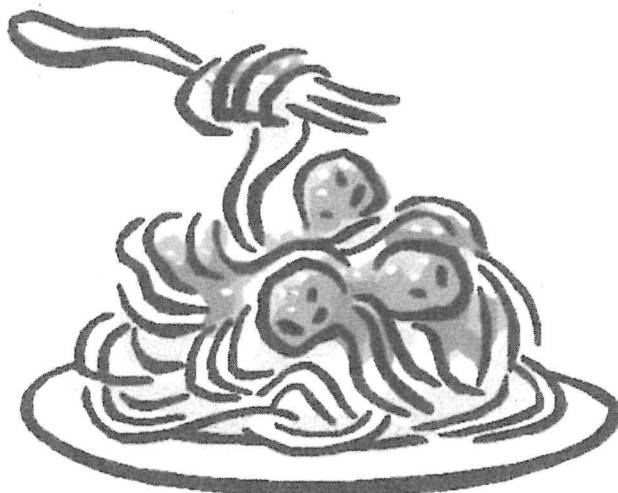
### **Finance Committee – Did You Know?**

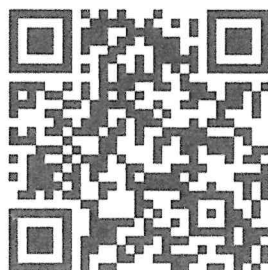
